SHORT HISTORY

WHERE IT ALL STARTED

Jeffreys Bay is named after Captain Jeffrey who sailed his cargo ship around the coast of South Africa in the 1840's. Unfortunately due to an epidemic of scurvy he and his crew were forced to land his ship on the beach. Captain Jeffrey built the first house in Jeffrey's Bay and erected it in 1850, a double story mansion which he named the "White House".

The first trading station became active in 1868 which started to lure people to the town and since then it has seen huge growth. The beautiful beaches combined with the best right hand surf breaks in the world has placed Jeffrey's Bay on the world map.

THE WAVES

JEFFREYS BAY SURF

Jeffreys Bay is one of the best surfing destinations and is renowned for its beautiful beaches and surfing waves with many different surf breaks. Surfing spots include Kitchen Window, Magnatubes, Super Tubes, Point and Albatross. The waves at Supertubes can reach in excess of 10 - 12 feet, one of the best right wave breaks on the planet.

The swells improve in the winter months. With quite a few options for a great day in the surf is Boneyards which is next to Supers. Point is situated east of Supertubes, the waves here are a tad smaller than those at Boneyards and Supers however you can expect a much longer ride than Boneyards and Supertubes.

FAUNA AND FLORA

Jeffreys Bay's beaches are known for good angling. Fish species caught here: Cob, leerfish, Garrick, Grunter, White Steenbras, Blacktail, Musselcracker, Baardman, Red Steenbras, Poenskop, Roman, Dageraad, Elf, various shark species and Rays.

Nature lovers will enjoy the recreation offered by the 3 nature reserves under the management of the Cape Nature Conservation.

For hikers trails include the Kabeljous nature reserve, Cape St Francis and the Tsitsikama hiking trail.

Whales and Dolphins in the Eastern and Western Cape



	<p>KILLER WHALE Lives for 50-100 yrs, 25 feet long eats fish, squid, sharks, seals dolphins, rays, seabirds etc</p>
	<p>HUMPBACK WHALE Lives for 45-50 yrs, 18m long, eats shrimp, crustaceans (Krill) and small fishes</p>
	<p>SOUTHERN RIGHT WHALE Life span 80yrs, 43-56 feet long eats plankton and krill</p>
	<p>LONG-BEAKED COMMON DOLPHIN Life span +- 40yrs, 2.5m long diet anchovies, sardines and other schooling fish</p>
	<p>BRYDE'S WHALE Life span +- 50-70yrs, 15m long eats krill, copepods, red crabs, shrimp and small fish like mackerel, pilchards and sardines</p>
	<p>INDIAN BOTTLENOSE DOLPHIN Lives for 30-50 yrs, 2.6m long eats fish, squid, crabs and shrimp</p>

Small Mammals of the Supertubes Nature Reserve



The Cape Gennet grows to 1 meter weighs 2Kg and has a life span of 15-22 years. (Omnivores) Diet includes small mammals / rodents / shrews / bats / birds and their eggs, frogs / millipedes / scorpions and various fruits



The Blue Duiker grows to a weight of 4Kg and up to 12 years old. (Herbivores) The blue duiker is a herbivore, predominantly feeding on plants. They mutually coexist with fruit-eating animals like Cape Parrots, Samango monkeys and baboons, since they feed on the freshly fallen fruits and leaves resulting from the activities of these animals



The Cape Otter reaches over 110cm -160cm and can weighing as much as 10-18 Kg living up to 12 years. (Omnivores) Diets mainly on crabs, but will also take fish, frogs, lobsters, birds, insects, reptiles, molluscs and small mammals



The Cape Porcupine in length 75 - 100cm weighing up to 24Kg with a life span of 12-15 years. (Herbivores) Cape porcupines are typically herbivorous, consuming mainly underground plant storage organs such as the bulbs, tubers and roots. They also feed on epigeal plant parts such as leaves, shoots, stems, tree barks and fruits



The Cape Grysbok grows to a length of 54cm weighing 10Kg and has a lifespan of 8-10 years. (Herbivores) This is predominantly a browser, and not dependant of free water. Occasionally grazes succulent grass and eats fruit when available



Yellow Mongoose in length 40-60cm weighing 450gms - 900gms reaching 12-15 years. (Carnivores) Yellow mongooses are opportunistic feeders and insects form the bulk of their diet, but they will also readily feed on amphibians, rodents and reptiles, including snakes and lizards. Yellow mongooses also eat carrion

Reptiles of the Supertubes Nature Reserve



Dwarf Chameleon 10g lifespan 3yrs (Insectivores) dwarf chameleons are primarily insectivorous; they prey upon flies, grasshoppers, crickets, insect larvae and other small invertebrates. They catch their food by waiting in ambush for passing insects or by patrolling through vegetation searching for prey



Common Slug Eater Length 35cm lifespan 10yrs (Molluscivores) As the name implies, the common slug eater is a specialised predator and feeds on snails and slugs, mostly finding its prey through chemoreception, using its tongue



Olive Ground Snake Length 75 - 130cm lifespan 20yrs (Carnivores) These large robust nocturnal snakes with a varied diet ranging from frogs, geckos, lizards small mammals, birds and even other snakes they've been known to be highly cannibalistic



Boomslang Length +2m / 510g lifespan 8yrs (Carnivores) The boomslang is diurnal (active during the day). The snake feeds on birds, nestlings, frogs, lizards and occasionally on small mammals



Puff adder Length / weight +1m / 6kg (Carnivores) Rodents make up most of a puff adder's diet, though the snake will eat other small mammals, birds, lizards, frogs, and toads. These snakes hunt by ambush. They hide and wait for prey to wander by, then strike with stunning swiftness



Angulate Tortoise 30cm / 2kg lifespan 30yrs (Herbivores) Tortoises are herbivorous and their diet includes grasses, annuals and succulent plants

Addo Elephant Park

And The BIG 5



An elephant's trunk weighs 400 pounds, but it can pick up things as small as a single grain of rice. They are afraid of bees. Farmers even use beehives to deter elephants from coming onto their land. Elephants can have babies until they're 50 years old. Elephants are pregnant for 22 months — it's the longest gestation period of any mammal. Elephants are born blind. The oldest elephant lived to be 86. African bush elephants are the largest land animals in the world — they can weigh up to 14,000 pounds. They can spend 16 hours a day eating.



Lions are social animals
Lions don't need to drink every day but need to eat
Female lions do most of the hunting
Lions don't live in jungles
Female lions raise cubs together
Lions are the second largest cats on earth
Lions once existed in Europe



They are pound for pound the strongest of the big cats.
Leopards are predominantly solitary animals that have large territories. Like cats kept as companions, leopards will growl when angry and purr when content. Leopards tend to have two or three cubs per gestation. During the National Geographic programme 'Eye of the Leopard', a wild leopard killed a baboon in order to feed herself. However upon noticing an infant baboon clinging to the dead baboon, the leopard amazingly carried the infant up to the safety of the tree to guard her from hyenas. She groomed and cuddled the baby throughout the night, caring for him/her as she would her own cub.



Wildebeest are Playful and Intelligent Animals
There are Two Species of Wildebeest
They live in Huge Herds
Wildebeest reproduce quickly and produce about 150 offspring every spring season. When female wildebeest get pregnant, their pregnancies last for 8.5 months.



White and black rhinos are actually the same colour
The name rhinoceros means 'nose horn'
Only elephants are bigger than white rhinos
Rhinos have small brains
Running at 30-40 miles per hour, be sure to move out of their way fast.
